THE COURT: All right. This is a motion for an adversary preliminary hearing. State, go ahead.

MS. LASKOFF: Yes, your Honor. I had spoken with counsel. I would not ordinarily put the

THE COURT: That's fine. Let's go ahead and call her. You said the Medical Examiner?

MR. DOBBS: Acknowledging that the burden of Proving a crime proof in trial was committed by the Defendant rests on the State and it's the reason for this hearing. This Court assumes the position of understanding that those people were injured and, in fact, does not prove that a crime was committed by the Defendant.

And in examining the facts the Court shall find that all actions taken by the Defendant were within his legal rights to defend himself provided and protected by Florida Statute 782.02, Florida Statute 782.03 and Florida Statute 776.013(3) --

And the one to the abdomen that knicked the liver could be lethal, but at the time we did the autopsy there was only about 20 or 30 cc's of blood in the abdomen. So at the time he got that wound, he didn't have a lot of blood pressure. If he had no other wounds and he had blood pressure, you can bleed to death from a laceration to your liver.

MS. LASKOFF: Okay. I have nothing further, your Honor.

THE COURT: Thank you. Ms. Chien?

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MS. CHIEN:

Q Is it Dr. Hansen?

A Yes.

Q Okay. Can you tell from the multiple stab wounds that the alleged victim -- the victim sustained whether or not they had been inflicted by in self-defense or if the person who inflicted it was the aggressor, can you tell that from the stab wounds itself?

A No. We have a stab wound -- I can tell you the angles that are going through the body. There don't appear to be any defensive wounds on the hands or arms except -- I'm sorry. There is a triangular abrasion at the base of the left thumb.

Q And what does that mean?

A And those might be abrasions that you get when we got a hand up trying to stop or defend against a knife.

Q Can you tell that for sure that that is the way that it must have been sustained, the one --

A No. No. Those are abrasions that could be done that way.

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object. This is a probable cause hearing. This isn't a trial where the Defendant is establishing a self-defense. It's simply the State establishing a probable cause for these charges. Therefore, I did not go into all the other information.

THE COURT: I agree with you. But I will let her answer that. You can -- if you can answer that, you can.

THE WITNESS: Okay. I can tell you the angle of the stab wound, but I can't tell you the intent of the person. Depending upon the relative positions of the assailant and the victim, it could be part of -- it could be part of a fight and -- all I can say is that the wound from the left is going from the upper left down and into the heart.

The wound from the right chest is inferior medial to the nipple and it is going down through the lung through the right diaphragm almost straight down and the one to the upper abdomen is going under the rib cage and into the liver.

- A I started up my car. I'm waiting for the rest of my friends to follow up, to catch up to the car. And then I heard an argument.
 - Q Okay. Did you see who was arguing?

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Okay. And did you hear about what was being argued about?


Not exactly, no.

Okay. And so there was a girl on the passenger side of the car screaming; is that the argument you were hearing?

- A Yeah.
- Okay. And then what happened? Q
- Then the car drove and parked next to the A left side of my car, to the left side of my driver door.
 - Immediately next to you or some spots down? 0
 - Some spots down. A
 - Okay. Q
- And then from that point I really can't tell A you what happened because I got stuck in the face and I



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went blank from that point on out so I really don't have a good description of what happened.

- Q Can you tell the Court -- you're in your car.

 How did you get out of your car?
 - A How did I get out of my car?
 - Q Uh-huh.

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- A I got in my car and just cranked the car up and just walked to the rear of my car.
 - Q Okay. So you got out of your car?
 - A Yes.
- Q Did you see anything else as you walked to the rear of your car before you got stabbed in the face?
 - A Did I see any -- rephrase it again, please.
- Q Did you see something when you walked around to the back of your car -- you got out of your car.

 What happened at that point?
 - A Like I said, it gets kind of blurry.
 - Q Okay.
- A So I can't really describe what happened exactly when I got to the back of the car.
 - Q Were you attacked?
 - A Yes. I was.
- Q Okay. And did some kind of a physical fight happen?

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Note: He said he 5 blacked out 6 then he said he went towards me and started 8 hitting me and describes me pulling Off and leaving Obviously he didn't 11 black out and he remembers himself hilting me till sometime right before I left. 13 14

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A Yes. From my recollection, a gentleman came, lunged at me, at my face. I didn't know I got stabbed. I got hit. I fell to the ground. Got back up then I seen the gentleman that actually hit me, went towards him, started hitting him and then I walked away because I guess I was feeling faint from the blood that I was losing not realizing that I was stabbed, but I was feeling faint. So I walked away.

And there was a girl in the background saying: You're too slow. You're too slow. They both -- the gentleman and the girl jumped into the car and took off fast.

Q Okay. Now, was it the gentleman that was fighting with you or was it the female that you were talking about that was fighting with you?

A The gentleman stabbed me, went towards his car and the female was arguing and they both got into the car at the same time.

Q Okay. And did you observe any other people fighting in the parking lot?

- A Yeah. Frank --
- Q Who's Frank? The full name.
- A Frank Gotay.
- Q Okay.
- A He actually when -- I guess when I got hit,

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went to the ground, he -- and after I hit the ground I went towards the guy and Frank was, I guess, he saw the commotion and went over there to help and then from right there, that's where it get hazy again.

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Q Okay.

Because I really can't tell what everybody else was doing.

How about -- were you able to see what happened with your friend with Will, William Troy?

A I got to see at the last minute when I looked over to the left after the car was taking off. looked over I saw him on the ground. So I ran over to him, started massaging him on his chest because I seen he had punctured wounds in his stomach and his chest.


And I'm trying to, you know, slap him on his face to stay alive because I figured the ambulance was coming and he would be all right, but he didn't make it.

Now, the injuries you sustained that night, did you have to have medical treatment?

Yes. I did.

And what treatment was it?

I got stabbed one time in the face -- no. Α Two times in the face; one right here and one right here. [Indicating] I got stitches for those. I got



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stabbed right here, one in my chest by my heart and one underneath here.

Q And have they left permanent marks on you?

A Yes. They have.

Q If you could just point them out to the Court, the injuries that were left as a result of you being stabbed.

A Right here to the right side of my face, left cheek. Stab wound right here.

THE COURT: You don't have to show. You can just point.

BY MS. LASKOFF:

Q And you have one where else, you can just point. You don't have to --

A In my chest right here. [Indicating]
THE COURT: Okay.

BY MS. LASKOFF:

- Q Okay.
- A And one underneath the arm.
- Q Okay.

MS. LASKOFF: I have nothing further, your Honor.

THE COURT: Thank you. Ms. Chien?

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CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MS. CHIEN:

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Q Mr. Blanco, when -- did you leave with all your other friends?

- A Leave from the club?
- Q Uh-huh.
- A No. I got escorted by the ambulance out.
- O You got what?
- A The ambulance took me to the hospital.
- Q Oh, no. When you first -- you were originally at the Doll House that night; is that correct?
 - A Yes.
 - Q And you were with your other friends?
 - A Yes. I was.
 - Q And the friends that you were with were who?
- A Frank Gotay, Anthony Riollano and William Troy.
- Q And when you were inside the club, had you seen any interaction between my client and Mr. Troy?
 - A No.
- Q Okay. Did you see any words exchanged inside the club between the two of them?
 - A No.
 - Q And when you came outside, did you come

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outside alone?

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- A Yes. I did.
- Q And you -- your friends they were still inside the club; is that correct?
 - A Yes. On the way out.
 - Q Okay. And you got into the car --
 - A Yes.
 - Q -- and you were driving that night?
 - A Yes.
 - Q And you had been drinking that night as well?
 - A Yes.
 - Q And how many drinks did you have?
 - A A few.

MS. LASKOFF: Your Honor, the State would argue, even though it's not my motion and the defense would be arguing first, that clearly the probable cause establishes the offenses. There was testimony regarding the second-degree murder case that the victim, William Troy, was stabbed multiple times about his body.

Though there was a physical altercation, it's been the testimony of several witnesses that it was a verbal altercation within the bar. Then something happens. At one point the Defendant and his girlfriend are in a vehicle actually and then they park their car and then the Defendant gets out of his car and then the fight starts.

And all of the victims, specifically it's clear that the Defendant had a knife rather than just his fist and the multiplicity of the injuries on the victim showed that his acts are eminently dangerous and obviously so to William Troy and evidence of a depraved mind regardless of human life.

And in that act, as the medical examiner

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testified, the victim's injuries were caused by a sharp object. The officers indicate also the Defendant was found with a knife, sharp object, in his vehicle which he admitted having and utilizing during this fight.

The State would also in regard to the other counts, the aggravated battery with a deadly weapon causing great bodily harm to Mr. Gotay and Mr. Blanco. Both of the victims came in and indicated that the Defendant stabbed both of them. Both of them have visible scarring, required multiple stitches for their injuries as a result of the Defendant's actions. None of them had weapons.

There's also the aggravated assault with a firearm and shooting from a vehicle charge. The Defendants made admissions to showing a gun, though he claims that it apparently was just there and he was cleaning it, I think is what Deputy -- Detective Phelan indicated when the victim of that case was driving up on the vehicle.

There is probable cause that the State has established for all the counts.

THE COURT: Thank you. Ms. Chien.

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CLOSING ARGUMENT

MS. CHIEN: Yes, your Honor. Even with the testimony that was provided to the Court that was heard today, the evidence does show that there was more than -- it was almost four against one or four against two and the actions, if any, that Mr. Dobbs took were in self-defense and it would be a issue for the trier of fact, which I did concede on that issue.

I have nothing else.

THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. Having listened to the evidence, the motion is filed under 3.133, an adversary preliminary hearing and the Defendant's charged with second-degree murder, three counts of aggravated -- actually, I'm sorry, two counts of aggravated battery with a deadly weapon or causing great bodily harm, one count of ag assault with a firearm and one count of shooting from a vehicle.

Having listened to the evidence, I find that there is probable cause for each of those charges and there is a -- I've heard information that leads me to believe the Defendant is the one involved. I think that's my only charge here at this hearing:

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Admittedly, there is certainly an argument as to Counts IV and V because I didn't hear too much else about the firearm, but I still think there's probable cause, which is a fairly low standard to hold him to answer for those charges.

So bottom line is, probable cause has been established that these crimes were committed and that the Defendant committed them. And that's it for today. Thank you.

The self-defense is still available and nothing's been waived and that'll be it.
